

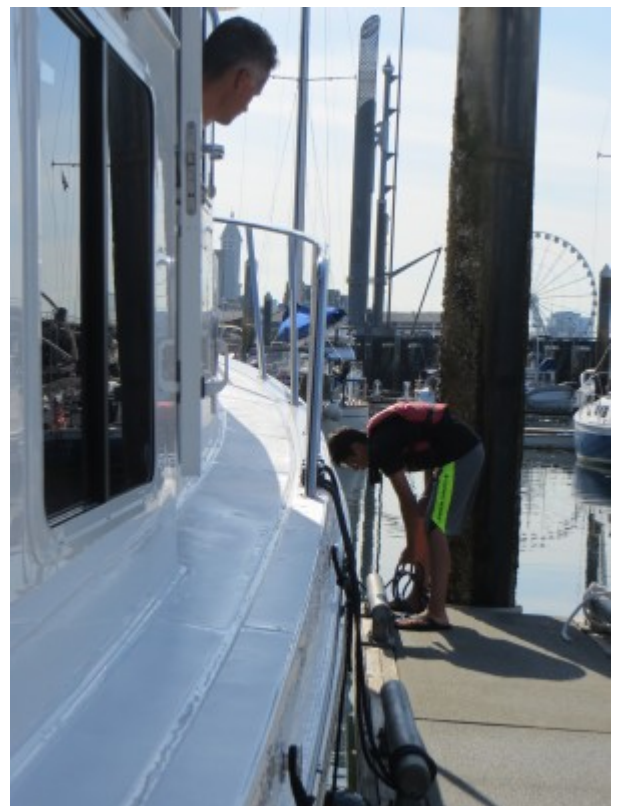


Family Bonding

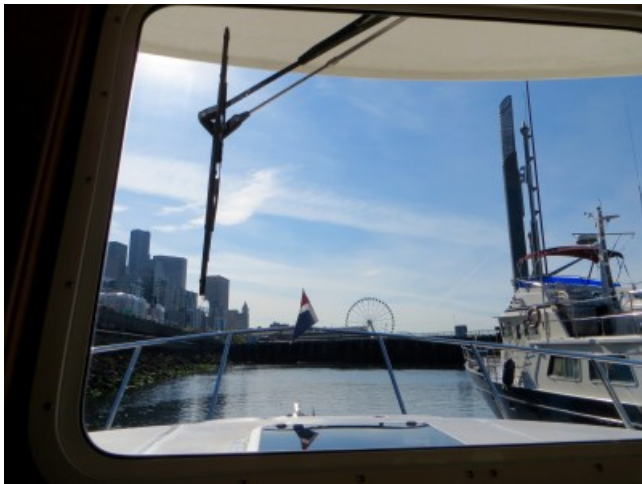

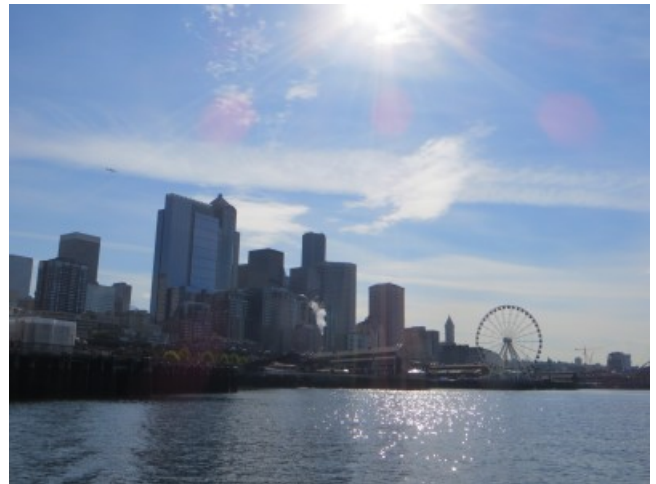
Final Trip Log – 593.39nm That's 682.87 Regular miles!

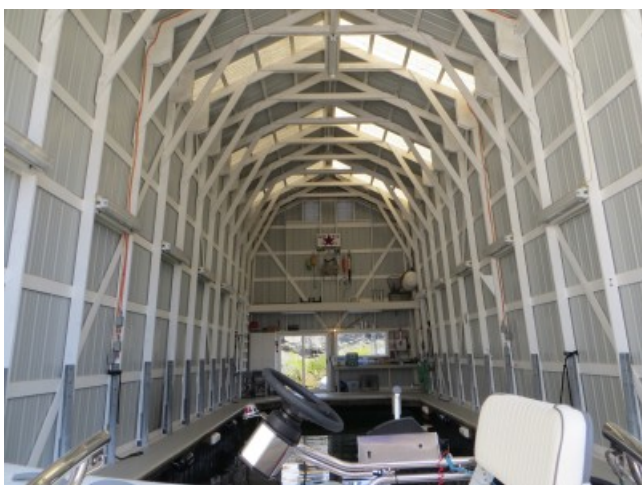
